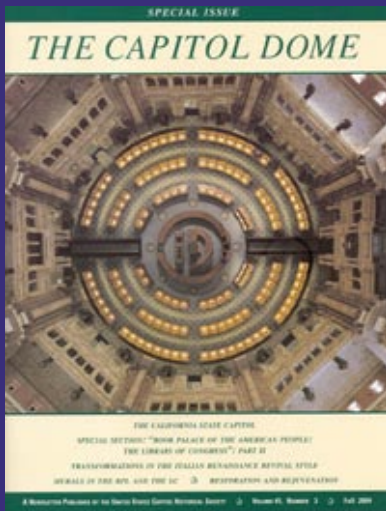
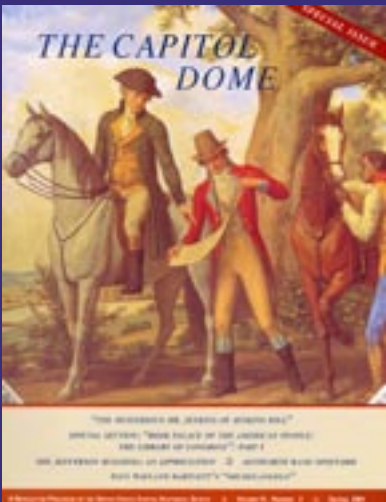


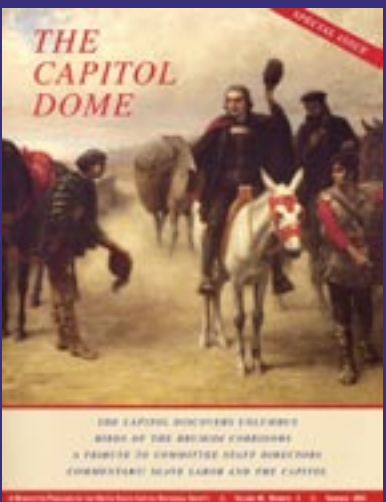

The United States Capitol Historical Society's *Quarterly Historical Newsletters*

The United States Capitol has housed the U.S. Congress for 200 years and is internationally recognized to embody the ideals of American representative government. Begun in 1793, the Capitol has been built, burnt, rebuilt, extended, and restored. Today it stands as a monument not only to its builders but to the American people and their government.

Based on Greek and Roman architectural styles, the Capitol covers four acres, contains 16.5 acres of floor space, is 751 feet long and at its greatest width 350 feet. It towers 287 1/2 feet from the base to the tip of the Statue of Freedom atop the cast iron dome. The Capitol contains many works of art depicting the history of the United States, the world's foremost democratic republic.

From the single rectangular shape, begun in 1793 that became the seat of the national legislature in 1800 for a country of 5 million. Today's strikingly domed building has become the most recognized government building in the world.

The United States Capitol Historical Society is chartered by Congress to educate the public about the Capitol, its Congress and the people who work there. Part of the mission is performed through the quarterly newsletters available to you at a nominal shipping fee of \$5.95.
